2	Archives and History		x	Inga Filippo reports that the Phase I of the project to preserve TLA records is nearing completion. Inga Filippo reports that it has been a pleasure to read through the organization's records and looks forward to sharing these via digitization. Jeanne Sugg thanks this committee for their work. Kevin Reynolds asks about restriction clause mentioned in the report - Inga Filippo reports they will push this next year. Inga Filippo reports the committee will need a budget of \$75 per reel to complete the digitization project.
3	ByLaws and Procedures		x	Dinah Harris moves the first bylaws change in the report. Scott Cohen seconds. Dinah Harris clarifies the motion means to establish one-vote-per-person (rather than one-vote-per-position). Larry Romans challenges the phrase "majority of present" and moves to remove "majority of". Ann Clapp seconds. Motion carries. Sue Szostak moves to add "(no proxies allowed)"; Theresa McMahan seconds. Wendy Cornelisen notes that Robert's Rules articulates that no proxies are allowed to vote - the explicit statement "no proxies allowed" would be redundant. Sue Knoche returns to the quorum issue, asks whether allowing a minority of Board members (those attending) is right. Annelle Huggins notes that committee members alone would be 35 attendees. Larry Romans moves to table the motion to the next meeting. Annelle Huggins, Cathy Farley plead with Directors to comment on tnla.org forum. Annelle Huggins notes the bylaws must be voted for change at the next Board meeting or the changes will not make the membership ballot. Martha Gill asks whether the Board determines bylaws. Huggins clarifies that Executive Committee is the deciding body of TLA. Ann Clapp asks for a definition of proxy. Cathy Farley notes Robert's Rules contains a definition of proxy and that this definition is posted to the tnla.org forum. Sue Szostak removes her motion. Larry Romans moves "20% of the voting members of the Board shall constitute a quorum. Each person serving on the Board of Directors shall have one vote. No proxies are allowed." Sue Szostak

				seconds. Unanimous approval. Regarding the second bylaws change advocated in the Bylaws Committee report: Cathy Farley moves this change be adopted and Wendy Cornelisen seconds this motion. In discussion, Larry Romans asks whether Kevin Reynold's dual roles as ALA Councilor and President would be a violation after this change. Cathy Farley opines that, no, Kevin Reynold's multiple positions would not stand in violation, that there is a difference between Executive Committe positions which are at issue and other balloted positions like SELA and ALA Councilor which are not. The motion carries following a voice vote, although not unanimously. Regarding the third recommended change from the Bylaws Committee report, Cathy Farley moves to accept this change, and Ann Clapp seconds. In discussion, Sue Knoche asks about conference prices. Huggins clarifies that THeSLA, TASL, and SELA are always offered TLA membership rate attendance at conferences. The motion carries unanimously.
4	Conference Planning		x	Ann Clapp presents on the behalf of the Conference Planning Committee. Ann Clapp notes the conference theme is "Marketing matters"; the all-conference event is at the Stax Museum of American Soul Music; Unshelved's Bill Barnes has almost been secured as the general session speaker. Annelle Huggins asks that we all encourage folks to share rooms at the conference hotel, and she will post this to the conference web site. Kevin Reynolds encourages submissions for programs.

Excluded from this application are the state's urban and metro library systems. The applicants will hear a response from the federal stimulus grantors in November. If the application is approved in November, funds will available in December. The application includes a budget for wireless coverage for 10,000 square miles and 150,000 Tennessee residents, as well as public computer centers and training. The Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development has offered \$1 million as part of a required 20% match. Kevin Reynolds notes appreciation of this extraordinary effort.
